

Waha – San Elizario (Texas, USA) Gas Pipeline

- The Waha – San Elizario gas pipeline will transport natural gas from the Waha, Texas region to meet the requirements of the electricity sector in the Central, Northern and Western regions of Mexico. This natural gas system will interconnect with the San Isidro – Samalayuca gas pipeline on the Mexican side of the border, which is currently in bidding process.
- Since this project will be located in the United States, it will be tendered in accordance with the process of that country through a Request for Proposal (RFP).
- Transparencia Mexicana will participate in this bidding process as the accompanying figure. The Request for Proposal will be issued in the coming days, as soon as the Energy Regulatory Commission issues its authorization.

Project Details:

- The project includes the design, engineering, supply, construction, operation and maintenance of the gas pipeline.
- This gas pipeline will be approximately 290 km long and 42-inch diameter. It will have a capacity of 1,135 million cubic feet per day (MCFD) for gas transportation between Waha and San Elizario, both destinations located in the southern part of the State of Texas in the United States of America.
- The estimated project implementation period is 22 months.
